Academics

The small sixth form college environment of Earlscliffe provides students with a unique experience, offering a personalized education, small class sizes, cultural enrichment, and boundless support, while guiding students through the university admission process.

International Transition Year (GCSE)

Earlscliffe offers international students this year-long program to prepare for A-Levels or an IB Program while improving English language skills and completing up to five GCSE/IGCSE examinations.

A-Levels

Earlscliffe is known for its intensive A-Level program with traditional subjects and offers 9 lessons per week per subject. Students will choose four subjects (including their own language) to study for this 2-year program along with the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) and IELTS exam preparation.

Business Diploma

For students aged 17+, this one-year program is equivalent to two A-Levels and includes six modules covering aspects of Business and Management, accompanied by a full A-Level in the student's native language and one other A-Level in a non-examined academic subject.

Dukes University Foundation Certificate

This one-year course is designed for students who have completed their own country's secondary school certification,

and wish to prepare for entry to a UK University. The four pathways include: STEM (in collaboration with Cardiff Sixth Form College); Humanities; Creative Arts; and Business, Economics and Management.

Success Rate

98% of students are accepted to University.

Campus Life

The Earlscliffe campus is located in the seaside town of Folkestone. There are five single-gender boarding houses, two for girls and three for boys, all within walking distance of the main campus where students live in spacious twin rooms with private bathroom, and are supervised by House Managers who provide daily support and overall pastoral care.

Activities

Extracurricular activities include various clubs and societies, annual mathematics and debating competitions, running club, drama club, and community service opportunities, among others. The school also offers group trips to London, as well as to other cities in France and Belgium for weekend cultural trips.

Sports

Students participate in sports on weekday evenings and weekends, including: Badminton, Basketball, Squash, Table Tennis, Volleyball, and competitive league play in Football (soccer). There is also a gym and large indoor pool nearby, to which students have free access. Golf and Tennis are also offered during the summer months.
