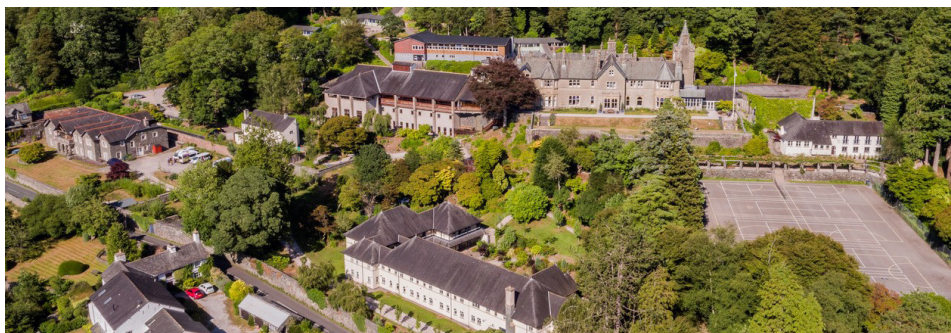

Academics

Windermere School prides itself on following the Round Square pillars of Internationalism, Democracy, Environmentalism, Adventure, Leadership, and Service. Within this framework, they provide an array of educational opportunities for students to explore.

Senior School

For students in Years 7 to 11, the curriculum of Senior School is designed to be both challenging and flexible, and tailored to each student. In Years 10 and 11, students have 9 courses to study for their GCSE/ICGSE options, including English Language, English Literature, Mathematics, and Foreign Language (French or Spanish), as well as choosing six additional GCSE subjects, split as three each in Year 10 and Year 11.

International Baccalaureate (IB) Program

For students in Years 12-13, Windermere offers the full International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Program, as well as individual IB Certificates in traditional subjects. Students may also take BTEC National qualifications for further career training in areas including, Business, Music and Sport.

EAL Program

Dedicated specialists provide support and teaching of English as an Additional Language across Windermere programs.

Success Rate

90% of students are accepted to University.

Campus Life

The Browhead campus at Windermere is home to the Senior School and Sixth Form as well as the boarding houses, Crampton Hall auditorium, library, study centres, Hoist Room (music space), sports pitch, tennis courts, and a separate sports hall. The school also has its own Watersports Centre on Lake Windermere. Students aged 8-16 live in Langdale House (boys) or Browhead (girls) in double or single rooms. Sixth Form students live in self-contained flats of 3 bedrooms with shared bathroom and common room in Westmorland House. Boarding staff provide a high level of pastoral care, and each student also has a personal tutor and is part of a small tutor group for additional support.

Activities

Students can participate in a range of creative and academic clubs and societies, including debating society, art club, badminton, horse riding, dance, and many others. Additional fun and adventure activities are offered on weekends, as well as a number of cultural trips each year.

Sports

Students can participate in water sports including: Recreational Sailing, Race Team Sailing, Recreational Kayaking and Canoeing; as well as traditional team sports: Netball, Hockey, Football (soccer), and Tennis.
